A BILL

- To require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to issue guidance for, and provide oversight of, the management of micropurchases made with Governmentwide commercial purchase cards, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Purchase Card Waste5 Elimination Act of 2005".

6 SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT FOR GUIDANCE.

7 (a) OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET POLICY8 GUIDANCE.—Not later than 180 days after the date of

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1 the enactment of this Act, the Director of the Office of
2 Management and Budget shall issue guidelines to assist
3 the heads of executive agencies in improving the manage4 ment of the use of the Governmentwide commercial pur5 chase card for making micropurchases. The Director shall
6 include guidelines on the following matters:

7 (1) Analysis of purchase card expenditures to
8 identify opportunities for achieving savings through
9 micropurchases made in economical volumes.

10 (2) Negotiation of discount agreements with11 major vendors accepting the purchase card.

(3) Establishment of communication programs
to ensure that purchase card holders receive information pertaining to the availability of discounts, including programs for the training of purchase card
holders on the availability of discounts.

17 (4) Assessment of cardholder purchasing prac-18 tices.

19 (5) Collection and dissemination of best prac20 tices and successful strategies for achieving savings
21 in micropurchases.

(b) GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION.—The Administrator of General Services shall direct the purchase
card program manager of the General Services
Administration—

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(1) to continue efforts to improve reporting by
 financial institutions that issue the Governmentwide
 commercial purchase card so that the General Serv ices Administration has the data needed to identify
 opportunities for achieving savings; and

6 (2) to ensure that the acquisition center con-7 tracting officers of the General Services Administra-8 tion actively pursue point-of-sale discounts with 9 major vendors accepting the purchase card so that 10 any Federal Government purchaser using the pur-11 chase card can benefit from such point-of-sale dis-12 counts.

(c) AGENCY REPORTING REQUIREMENT.—The purchase card program manager for each executive agency
shall, as directed by the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, submit to the Director periodic reports
on the actions taken in such executive agency pursuant
to the guidelines issued under subsection (a).

(d) CONGRESSIONAL OVERSIGHT.—Not later than
December 31 of the year following the year in which this
Act is enacted, and December 31 of each of the ensuing
three years, the Director of the Office of Management and
Budget shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on Government Reform of the House of Represent-

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atives a report summarizing the progress made during the
 fiscal year ending in the year in which such report is
 due—

4 (1) in improving the management of the use of
5 the Governmentwide commercial purchase card for
6 making micropurchases; and

7 (2) in achieving savings in micropurchases
8 made with such card, expressed in terms of savings
9 achieved by each executive agency and the total sav10 ings achieved Governmentwide.

11 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) The term "executive agency" has the meaning given such term in section 4 of the Office of
Federal Procurement Policy Act (41 U.S.C. 403).

(2) The term "micropurchase" means a purchase in an amount not in excess of the micropurchase threshold, as defined in section 32 of such Act
(41 U.S.C. 428).
