

Dave "Kumo" Kumashiro

Kumo is the Director, Research and Analysis at the National Security Commission on Artificial Intelligence (NSCAI), Arlington, Virginia. He leads a team focused on the application of artificial intelligence in National Security Missions. NSCAI was established by the 2019 National Defense Authorization Act to consider the methods and means necessary to advance the development of artificial intelligence, machine learning, and associated technologies to comprehensively address the national security and defense needs of the United States. Prior to his current position, Kumo was the Director, Joint Force Integration at Headquarters Air Force. He was also dual-hatted as the Air Force's cross-functional team lead for Joint All Domain Command and Control.

Dave retired from the United States Air Force in 2020 as a brigadier general after serving more than 28 years. While in the Air Force, he commanded at various operational levels including as a C-17 wing commander and served in a diverse array of Joint and Air Force enterprise areas including operations, logistics, resourcing, strategy, executive talent management, and warfighter integration.

He is a command pilot with more than 3,500 hours in the C-17A, C-5A/B and the RQ/MQ-1.
