

DoD COVID-19 UPDATE

March 23, 2020

Key Developments

- USNS Mercy deploys today in support of the nation's COVID-19 response efforts, providing a spectrum of medical care to include critical and urgent care for adults.
- The U.S. Air Force flew an en-route patient staging system for the Italian Ministry of Defense to Aviano, Italy, capable of supporting 40 patients in a 24-hour period.
- U.S. Air Force Air Mobility Command temporarily suspended most Space-A travel to increase force health protection measures and decrease risk to DoD mission.
- The U.S. Air Force flew a U.S. women's football team home from Honduras after the country closed its borders.
- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers received a FEMA mission assignment to provide initial planning and engineering support to address possible medical facility shortfalls in the United States.
- U.S. Army North, in response to a FEMA request, activated ten Defense Coordinating Elements, co-located with each FEMA regional headquarters, to coordinate federal military assistance requests.
- USNORTHCOM has a total of 1,322 passengers from Grand Princess at Travis AFB (825), Lackland AFB (120), MCAS Miramar (180), Dobbins ARB/Clay (197)
