

NAVY COVID-19 UPDATE

April 14, 2020

Key Developments

- As of today, 93% of USS Theodore Roosevelt crewmembers have been tested for COVID-19, with 589 positive and 3,922 negative results. 4,024 Sailors have moved ashore.
- Four Sailors assigned to USS Theodore Roosevelt are in U.S. Naval Hospital Guam being treated for COVID-19 symptoms. One of those Sailors is in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) for increased observation due to shortness of breath.
- Seven Medical Treatment Facility crewmembers on board USNS Mercy have tested positive for COVID-19 and are currently isolated off the ship. All who were considered to have been in close contact with those crewmembers remain in quarantine off the ship and have tested negative for COVID-19 with the exception of one crewmember who was the fifth confirmed positive case. The ship is following protocols and taking every precaution to ensure the health and safety of all crewmembers and patients on board. This will not affect the ability for Mercy to receive patients at this time.
