

Dr. Roff received her Ph.D in Political Science from the University of Colorado at Boulder (2010). She is currently a Senior Research Analyst in the National Security Analysis Department at the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Lab, an Associate Fellow at the Leverhulme Centre for the Future of Intelligence at the University of Cambridge, and a nonresidential Fellow in Foreign Policy at Brookings Institution. Prior to joining APL, she was a Senior Research Scientist at DeepMind, a Senior Research Fellow in the Department of Politics and International Relations at the University of Oxford, a Research Scientist in the Global Security Initiative at Arizona State University, and has held faculty positions at the Korbel School of International Studies at the University of Denver, the University of Waterloo, and the United States Air Force Academy. Prior fellowships include New America in the Cybersecurity Initiative and the Future of War Project. Her research interests include the law, policy and ethics of emerging military technologies, such as autonomous weapons, artificial intelligence, robotics and cyber, as well as international security and human rights protection.
